Fresh and enticing flavours of cut grass, bell peppers and yellow fruits with lively citrus acidity ,highly recommended.
2. Sancerre A.C., 'Terroirs', Domaine Sylvain Bailly. 2004 £18.25
Fresh, grapey with a steely edge and fine mineral finish.
3. Chablis A.C., Domaine de l'Harmonie . 2003 £17.95
Fine Chablis from a family domaine is quite a rarity.
Jean-Marc Brocard's is one of the best.

NEW ZEALAND.

4. Sauvignon Blanc ,CJ Pask, Hawkes Bay. 2004 £16.50
Currant leaf aromas ,slightly minerally elegance of flavour, hints of lime and tropical fruits.

CHILE

6. Sauvignon Blanc, San Andreas. 2007 £12.95
Crisp, refreshing Sauvignon with excellent fruit acidity.
7. Chardonnay, San Andreas. 2007 £12.95
Neat balance of oak and fruit, a touch of spice and unexpected elegance.

ITALY

8. Pinot Grigio, Endrizze, Trentino. 2004 £17.50
A great example of Pinot Grigio. Soft angelica characters lie behind smoky flavours of wild pears.

AUSTRALIA

9. Semillon / Chardonnay, Canoe Tree, South East Australia. 2006 £14.50
Fresh, zesty and lemony fruit. Excellent depth of flavour.

SPAIN

22. Rioja, Navardia, Bodegas Bagordi. 2004 £14.25
Warm red fruits plus a touch of spice.

NEW ZEALAND

24. Pinot Noir, Forrest Estate, Marlborough. 2003 £17.50
Tightly structured, this has gamey red fruit flavours and classic Pinot texture.

CLILE

25. Merlot, San Andeas. 2006 £12.95
A good depth of soft fruits, Merlot plum and cherries.
26. Cabernet Sauvignon, San Andreas. 2006 £12.95
Typical berry fruits on the nose and palate.

AUSTRALIA

28. Shiraz / Cabernet, Canoe Tree, South East Australia. 2004 £14.50
Soft, ripe, this is always a crowd-pleaser with its' generous fruit and spice.
29. Cabernet Sauvignon./ Merlot, Juniper Crossing, Margaret River, Western Australia. 2001 £18.75
Youthful and vigorous with plenty of lively black fruit. Recommended.

SOUTH AFRICA

30. Pinotage, Rouwkes Drift. £12.95
A fine example of the blend between Cinsault and Pinot Noir.
